

What Luther says:

In someone's book, probably a copy of the Bible, Luther once wrote the following comment on John 10:28.

Let Him see and care where my soul will stay who has so faithfully provided for me that He has sacrificed His life in order to redeem my soul. Praise to Him throughout eternity, to the one true and faithful Shepherd and Bishop of all souls that believe on Him! Moreover, He will not even begin to learn from me how to preserve and protect the poor souls who hear and heed His voice against the power of the devil and the wickedness and tyranny of the world. (WLS p. 324)

At the court of Abimelech Isaac passed off his wife as his sister because he feared for his safety (Genesis 26:9). Yet in the light of Godøs promise he had no need to resort to a lie. But his faith weakened, and he began to doubt. In his lecture on this story Luther says that this is exactly the trouble with all who question the clear promise of Godøs saving love. The Reformerøs monastic superior once told him that this was his (Lutherøs) trouble too.

Staupitz consoled me with these words: Why do you torture yourself with these speculations? Look at the wounds of Christ and at the blood He shed for you; from these your election will shine forth. Therefore we must hear the Son of God, who was sent into the flesh and has appeared for the purpose of destroying the work of the devil and making you certain of your election. So He tells you: õYou are My Sheep because you hear My voice; and no one shall pluck you out of my hands.ö (John 10:28) (WLS p. 460)

'Tis More Blessed to Give Than to Receive

"In all things I have shown you that by working hard in this way we must help the weak and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how he himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.' " (Acts 20:35)

And indeed, it is. Does this not strike a chord that resonates in us all? Which of us canot recall the look of surprise and thanks for the Christmas gifts that we labored to give to those whom we love? And the joy written on their face when that gift is received with thanksgiving means more than all the gifts we have received. It is more blessed to give than to receive.

Our Lord knew this because He practiced it. He gave of Himself ó sparing not even His life in death ó in order to give us back to our Father in heaven. He knew that in giving you get more because joy is multiplied in giving. The one who receives and the one who gives both rejoice in what is given and received. And, what is more, the one who receives only wants to give back to the one who gave so generously in thanksgiving.

So it is with our tithes and offerings in church. We want to give because we have received from God all that we are and all that we have. Our giving does not originate in what we must do to earn Godøs favor. We have Godøs favor because of His gift of His Son, given through Word and Sacrament. Thus, we are made free from the compulsion of giving so that our tithes and offering are freely given in thanksgiving for what God has so generously given to us.

Our fallen nature makes us selfish and miserly. It leads us to believe that we can have our cake and eat it, too. Because of sin, we want Godøs grace and mercy; we want His blessings of body and soul. But we donøt want to share it with those around us. We want to remain comfortable in our own self-contained, neat, and tidy lives ó without the headaches of loving those around us by helping them in their time of need.

Your tithes and offerings ensure that those around you have a pastor to preach the life-saving and life-giving Word of God. They ensure that the lights, heat, and air-conditioning are working. They ensure there is water for Holy Baptism as well as bread and wine for Holy Communion. They even ensure that your pastor has food and clothing and presents for his own family. The gifts of God are immeasurable. They multiply and redound to everyone good as the fish and loaves in the feeding of the five thousand.

So, remember the words of the Lord Jesus: õIt is more blessed to give than to receive. Ö And remember the joy that attended the gifts you gave at Christmas. This same joy attends your gifts to the church.

Physically and Spiritually Feeding Children in Lima, Peru

Spiritual and Physical Food for Children of Peru La Mision Luterana del Peru — \$56,750



For I was hungry and

you gave me food.

I was thirsty and you

gave me drink.

I was a stranger and

you welcomed me

(Matthew 25:35).

Castillo Fuerte Mercy House is the mercy arm of La Mision Luterana del Peru, the national Lutheran Mission of Peru. They provide for the physical and spiritual needs of children who are struggling to survive in one of the poorer districts in Lima, Peru. This grant will help provide food and supplies for this ministry.

Castillo Fuerte Mercy House is surrounded by families who struggle to provide for the basic needs of life. The parents are hardworking people who work long hours with very low pay and the children are often left on their own.

The LCMS missionaries started reaching out to these children at the local park after receiving the city's approval to use the park for church programs. This developed into the Castillo Fuerte Mercy House and a church plant where missionaries provide after school tutoring, educational classes, a soup kitchen, as well as lessons about who Jesus is and what He has done for their salvation.

Castillo Fuerte provides a safe place for the children to grow both physically and spiritually. They provide a healthy lunch for children each weekday. Castillo Fuerte has daily chapel time and catechism classes during the week. The missionaries are teaching the children to pray, memorize Scripture, and to talk about all that God has done for them.

The ministry began by serving the needs of the children. Through the children, missionaries are able to learn about the difficult situations at home and the physical and emotional needs of their parents. Castillo Fuerte has been able to provide the services of a social worker, psychologist, health professionals, and trained teachers to meet the needs of the parents and children. The children provide an open door to reach out to the parents and share the Gospel of Christ.

La Mision Luterana del Peru is also reaching out to Venezuelan refugees in the city of Lima who have fled their country to escape violence and political persecution or because of lack of food, medicine, and essential services. There are over 377,000 Venezuelan refugees living in the city. When they arrive, they find themselves with no money, no work, no place to live, and no friends or contacts to help them. La Mision Luterana has opened their doors to the refugees and help them find shelter, food and adjust to a new life in a new country.

This grant will help finance the work of Castillo Fuerte Mercy House and La Mision Luterana del Peru as they reach out to help with the physical and spiritual needs of children and adults in Lima. Peru.


Ladies! Birthday lunches aren't just for birthdays; of course birthdays for the month are celebrated, but also it gives us an informal excuse


