

Thank you for your support of our Preschool. We appreciate you!






#### What Luther says:

Scripture speaks of the church very simply and used the expression in one sense onlyí According to Scripture, the church is the assembly of all those on earth who believe in Christ, just as we pray in the Creed: õI believe in the Holy Ghostí a communion of saints.ö This community or assembly consists of all those who live in true faith, hope, and love, so that the essence, life, and nature of the church is not a bodily, but a spiritual assembly of hearts in one faith, as St. Paul says, Ephesians 4:5: õOne Baptism, one faith, one Lord.ö Hence, although they be a thousand miles apart in body, they are yet an assembly in spirit because each one preaches, believes, hopes, loves, and lives like the other. So we sing of the Holy Ghost: õThou, who through divers tongues gathers together the nations in the unity of faith.ö(1) Now that is what is properly called a spiritual unity, because of which men are called a ocommunion of saints.ö And only this unity is sufficient to make a church: without it no unity-be it of place, of time, of person, of work, or of whatever it may be-makes a church. (WLS p.260)

(1) This is from stanza one of Luther¢s translation (and revision) of the Latin Hymn õCome, Holy Ghost, God and Lord.ö Divers Tongues are supernatural utterances by the Holy Spirit in a language the speaker has never learned.

## The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod Stewardship Newsletter – January 2024

### The Chief Stewards of Humanity: Mom and Dad

St. Paul tells the Ephesians that the first commandment with a specific promise attached to it is, õHonor your father and mother so that it may go well with you, and you may live long in the landö (Eph. 6:2). This promise is one indication of the importance of this commandment. The other thing that highlights the special nature of this commandment is its placement within the Ten Commandments.

The Ten Commandments are clearly organized in two big categories. The first three commandments deal with our relationship with God. This category is called the First Table of the Law. The last seven commandments, the Second Table of the Law, tell us how we should relate to other people. These two tables correspond to what Jesus calls the two greatest commandments: õYou shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind,ö and õYou shall love your neighbor as yourselfö (Matt. 22:37ó39).

The order of the Second Table of the Law is also important. Murder is a greater sin than adultery, which is a greater sin that stealing, or lying, or coveting. But why is the Fourth Commandment first in the Second Table, ahead of õyou shall not murderö? Is disobeying your parents really worse than murder? Or maybe we should give up on thinking these commandments are ordered?

The overall effect of this order is to get us to see our parents as a connection point between our neighbors and our God. Throughout our upbringing our father and mother stand between us and God and deliver His gifts to us: God clothes us, feeds us, protects us and teaches His Word to us through our parents.

So, parents have a very high calling from God. They are called to be stewards of the greatest gift: the gift of life.

Parenting thus gives us a keen insight into all our stewardship. Parents know that they have been given a great treasure in their children, a treasure that does not belong to them, yet for which they feel a great deal of responsibility. Truth be told, every gift we have been given is like this, because everything we have ô whether our own personal skills and powers or our wealth and time ô is all from God. He entrusts it all to us so that we can use it all and take care of it all for His great purposes.

# The Light of Christ for the Blind and Visually Impaired

There are millions of people throughout the world who are blind or visually impaired and are seeking to strengthen their faith as they cope with isolation and deal with physical, mental, and spiritual struggles. They desire to be able to read the words of the Lord themselves, so that they can feel and learn about the love of God and the salvation of Jesus. Even with advancements in technology, they still have difficulties accessing scriptural and theologically-related reading materials.

It is estimated that approximately 95% of the 253 million people around the world with moderate to severe vision impairment are unchurched, yet when it comes to ministering to this community, there are fewer than a handful of Christian organizations reaching out to provide help. Lutheran Braille Workers (LBW) continues to provide Bibles and other Christian materials in braille or specialized large print to help this under reached population feel connected to the family of Christ and grow in their faith. Those who have received and benefited from LBW materials have shared that without these volumes, they might never have learned to read and obtain basic life skills needed to survive in the world today.

Lutheran Braille Workers has been freely supplying materials in large print and braille to people who are visually impaired for over eighty years. This grant will help with the formatting, producing, and distributing of fifty to one hundred new Scripture-based materials and add to the LBW collection of resources to meet the spiritual and emotional needs of recipients with vision impairments around the world. Some of the materials include Lutheran Hour Ministries Connect Booklets and American missionary books from Mission Nation Publishing. There is also cooperation with other LCMS partners, such as Concordia Publishing House and the LCMS Synodical Headquarters to gain access to more titles as needed. This grant will develop and provide materials beyond the Bible that will help Christians develop and strengthen their faith.


