


Decisions in Life "What good is it for a man to gain the whole world, yet forfeit his soul?" (Mark 8:36)

If you speak to any military leader who has made combat decisions you can see in his eyes that those decisions always came with consequences. They affect the lives of many people; the soldier, his or her fellow soldiers, family, and friends. You canot help but remember the mighty Titanic when we speak about decisions. When the captain was told that there was a threat of icebergs, he chose to follow the wishes of the shipos owners to try to set a speed record. You all know the outcome of that! Yes, our decisions in life have consequences; not only for us but the people around us!

Our Lord Jesus Christ spoke of a decision that involved life; in fact, eternal life. Jesus said, "What good is it for a man to gain the whole world, yet forfeit his soul?" as a free gift by the work of the Holy Spirit. Faith, which clings to Jesusølove, is given to us when we hear Godøs Word and are baptized. Faith is strengthened when we receive His true body and blood for the forgiveness of sins. Itøs ours as a free gift from God, that is, if we donøt reject it.

It is through the help of God that we can make the right decisions that keep us in the faith and live God pleasing lives. In Jesus plove, we can make proper choices about what vocation to follow, where to live, what schools to attend, where to seek recreation, who our friends will be, and who our spouse might be. In Jesus plove we can say, "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." (Joshua 24:15) In other words, the question that we should always ask ourselves as we make the many decisions in our lives is of How will the decision I make allow me to best serve my Lord?

Midweek Advent Worship This Is My Son

Midweek of Advent 1—November 30, 2022

Just as Godøs people of old waited with faith in the coming Messiah, so is our Advent anticipation of Christmas, as we sing of the Savior, õYour people long to greet You, My hope, my heartøs delight!ö (LSB 334:1). Our hopes and fears are real. They can distract us from Godøs promises. Godøs promise was from the beginning spoken to Adam and Eve. Salvation would come through the womanøs offspring (Genesis 3:15). But it would not be Cain, the son of Adam, nor Ishmael, the son of Abraham, nor Absalom, the son of David. The true Son of Adam and Abraham and David is the Son of God. Our attention and faith thus direct our hopes and fears to Godøs Son, in whom we receive adoption as sons and daughters in the family of God.

Midweek of Advent 2-December 7, 2022

Our Advent expectation continues as we wait to celebrate the gift of Godøs promised Son to be our Savior. Like us, Abraham struggled as Godøs promise seemed less likely to come about, especially as the years passed into decades. As our faith may at times grow weak, we are tempted to take matters into our own hands, only to discover that our efforts fail. That is one reason we are here again this day, in order that Godøs Word and Spirit strengthen our faith, even in the face of all doubts, to wait upon Godøs sure and gracious promises. The true Son of Abraham is the One whom God has sent and designated, saying, õThis is My beloved Son.ö Jesus brings all of Godøs promises together to make us sons and daughters of God. Believe it. Live it.

Midweek of Advent 3-December 14, 2022

By now, one would think we are getting the message. We often pin our hopes on passing things and even on people who cannot save. God promised to our first parents and then again to our õfather in faith,ö Abraham, that one of their descendants would be our Savior from sin and death. Though He was their son, however, it was not yet Cain or Ishmael. Godøs promise increased to the great king David, whose hopes were dashed with tears at the death of his son Absalom. Faith must hang on to the depth of Godøs promise. It would be generations before God would finally send His own perfect Son, whose Baptism, suffering, death, and rising would bring forgiveness, life, and salvation to all who are children of God by faith in Jesus, great Davidøs greater Son.

Nativity (Christmas)

We gather to celebrate the ultimate gift of God. This gift was promised at the very beginning of our need for a Savior from sin and from the last enemy, death, and He comes as the offspring of the woman. Yet the Promised One was not the son of Adam and certainly not Cain. Years later, the promise came to Abraham. But it was not yet the son of Abraham and certainly not Ishmael. Still the promise held to the great king David. But it was not yet the son of David and certainly not Absalom. Nevertheless, the promise was fulfilled through the house and lineage of David in the Son of Mary of Nazareth, the Son of God. To confirm this truth, both the evangelists Matthew and Luke give the genealogyô Matthew tracing the promise forward from Abraham, and Luke backward all the way to Adam. John describes the mystery of the Savior as a true human, born of the virgin Mary, and as true God, begotten of

God the Father. Let us celebrate the gift in His eternal life-giving flesh and blood with the awe and reverence of the new, eternal life of faith as true children of God.

What Luther says:

In a writing (1543) directed against Jewish slanderers of Christ, the Reformer maintains that if Christ were not our all sufficient divine Messiah, our interest in His mother, in Him, nay, in Scripture as such, would be negligible.

õHe who does not believe, or will not believe, that Jesus is the Messiah need not know who or where His mother is. Aye, it were better for him never to have heard one word of Scripture; and even better for him if he had not been born. For God has made everything depend on this Man [Jesus], has directed everything, has turned everything, has given everything into His hand. He who has Him is to have all; he who does not have Him is to have nothing.ö (WLS p. 202)

Martin Luther, therefore directed anxious souls to Christ, and to Him alone.

õAs sharers in the faith of Paul we should say: May there perish and be accursed every doctrine from heaven, from the earth, or whencesoever brought, which teaches man to place his confidence in works, in righteousness, in merits other than those which belong to Jesus Christ.ö (WLS, P. 202)

What Makes for a Cheerful Giver?

St. Paul wrote to Church of Christ in Corinth: õEach one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giverö (2 Cor. 9:7). *God loves a cheerful giver*. But who is a cheerful giver?

Abel was. By faith, he gave the firstborn of his flock, and it was acceptable in Godøs sight. Abraham was. By faith, he prepared cakes and a tender choice calf for God and entertained angels unaware. So also were David and Solomon. By faith, David would not make a sacrifice to God that cost him nothing, so he paid Araunah his due. By faith, Solomon built a house for God, where his name would dwell and thereby where He would dwell to be Israeløs God and they His people.

What more shall we say? For time would fail us to tell of all those who gave not simply for the joy of giving but for the joy of knowing the One to whom they gave.

So also our Lord, who for the joy set before Him, gave everything ó yes, even His life ó enduring the cross and scorning its shame. He gave to the shedding of His blood, willingly and resolutely setting His face toward Jerusalem to die for the life of the world. Though He was rich in every way, He became poor, so that by His poverty, we might be rich beyond measure.

So then, let us like Abel and Abraham, like David and Solomon, and even like our Lord Jesus Christ, give cheerfully to God for the work of His kingdom in our midst. Like them, let us decide in our heart for the joy set before us. Ito the joy of knowing the One to whom we give is the One who gives us all good things.

Mission Grant Story



St. Paul Christian Academy Providing Christ-Centered Outreach

The Littlest and Least of These — St. Paul Lutheran Church and Christian Academy — \$42,000



"Let the children come to me; do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of God" (Mark 10:14b). St. Paul Lutheran Church and Christian Academy in Dallas, Texas, located in a poor community of mostly unchurched families, offers Christ-centered early childhood education, before and after school care, and adult academic and Bible classes. St. Paul Lutheran Church is responding to the needs of families with a Christ-centered merciful outreach ministry. In a community dealing with intergenerational poverty and the challenges that come with it, the Christian Academy is available to help.

This grant is for the renovation of the fellowship hall of St. Paul Lutheran Church to better serve more children and adults in the Christian Academy. The Academy is planning to add on-site and online classes for young adults and parents in academic subjects, health and fitness, as well as Bible studies for new Christians. The grant allows for upgrades to the kitchen to meet state codes which will allow the feeding of the children daily – rather than relying on a catering firm – and to serve meals to parents, parishioners, and the community during special events.

By renovating this older building, the congregation and school can expand its preschool, infant care, before/after school education, and community outreach. It will provide functional space for classes and training programs such as: General Education Diploma (GED) classes, Computer Technology, English as a Second Language (ESL) classes, boys/girls mentoring, health and fitness training, job application and interviewing skills, healthy cooking classes, gardening, financial planning, parenting skills, as well as hosting Bible studies, satellite worship services, family fun nights, and other special programs and assemblies.

With its commitment to excellence, compassion, and faith, St. Paul members, volunteers, teachers, and staff can reach the community, helping change the lives of families by providing a safe and caring environment, healthy food, sound education, and the proclamation of the Good News of the Gospel.

Rev. Dr. Roosevelt Gray, Director, Black and African Missions, LCMS, stated: "Years of prayerful planning and faithful preaching led the congregation to establish St. Paul Christian Academy, the only Lutheran Christian Academy serving the historic Oak Cliff community and the lone African American congregation in LCMS Texas District with a Lutheran Christian Academy."






