

Jesus said, "Let the children be fed first, for it is not right to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs." (Mark 7: 27)

Can you imagine going to Jesus and having Him say that ito take the blessings of His chosen people and give it to the dogs? It doesnot seem right, but thatos exactly what Jesus said. Matthew gave us further understanding by recording what Jesus said to His disciples about this woman. Jesus said, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." (Matthew 15:24) Jesus reminded His disciples that His mission was limited to the people of Israel. This is further supported when Jesus sent out His twelve Apostles saying to them, "Go nowhere among the Gentiles and enter no town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." (Matthew 10:5-6). The disciples were to concentrate their immediate efforts on the Jewish people living in Galilee.

This created a huge problem for the woman Jesus was speaking to! After all, she was a Gentile. She was not from Israel. She was not a Jew. So, that would mean, that there was no way she could receive the blessing of having Jesus remove the demon from her daughter. Yet, she understood exactly who she was and said, "Yes Lord; even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs." (Mark 7:28)

What great faith! The woman whole heartedly accepted what Jesus said about the Divine arrangement of His Messianic Mission as being confined to the chosen nation Israel. She didnøt get angry. She didnøt try to change the language of Jesus. She didnøt try to rationalize what He said. She didnøt even ask why God did it that way. She accepted what Jesus said and would be happy with whatever blessing He saw fit to give her. Jesus said, "For this statement you may go your way; the demon has left

your daughter." (Mark 7:29) When the woman got home she found the child lying in bed and the demon gone.

As time went on, Jesus told His disciples "to make disciples of all nations." (Matthew 28:19) The Apostle Paul was called by our Lord to do missionary work to both the Jews and the Gentiles. Paul spoke about his missionary work when he wrote, "Rather through their [Israel] trespass [rejection of the Gospell salvation has come to the Gentiles, so as to make Israel jealous. Now if their trespass means riches for the world, and their failures means riches for the Gentiles, how much more will their full inclusion mean." (Romans 11:11-12) In other words, our Lord came for all people! No one lies beyond the scope of Jesusøgreat love and grace! It doesnøt matter who you are. Jesus, through the work of the Holy Spirit, wants all people to have faith so that they place their full trust in Him; just like the faith this Gentile woman demonstrated. For that reason, we continue to share Godøs Word, because "Faith comes from hearing and hearing through the word of Christ." (Romans 10:17). Amen

What Luther says:

In a sermon of the same year on Matthew 15:21-28, the story of the Syrophoenician Woman, the Doctor [Martin Luther] adduces Joseph as providing an instance of untiring prayer.

For about thirteen years Joseph cried and continued to pray to God to help him. But the longer, the worse; the more he prayed, the worse he fared. To this day this is what happens to Christians. When they have called and cried for a long time to God, they feel no improvement, but things grow worse, as they did with Joseph. If God had liberated Joseph, Jacob, his father, would no doubt have been glad; but Joseph would have remained a sheepherder. However, since the help was delayed so long, he became lord over all Egypt, so that certainly no greater man can be found in Holy Scripture, no one who rose higher as world ruler than did Joseph.

Thus God still intends to deal with us. After He has denied us our petition for a long while and always said no, but we firmly cling to the yes, it shall finally be yes, and not no, for His Word will not lie: õWhatsoever ye shall ask of the Father in My name, He will give it to you.ö (John 15:16) But our reason is highly offended at this delay and would gladly have God answer us promptly. So it is necessary not to be offended. Let our Lord God say no and suspend the answer of our petition for a year, two years, three years, or longer still, and let us only watch that hope and faith in His promise are not torn from the heart. Something will come of our prayer in the end, and God will give far more than we asked Him to give. (WLS p. 1090)

Stewardship in the First Commandment

The greatest gift that Martin Luther gave to us was his Small Catechism. The word õenchiridionö is part of the original title of this work. This is the Greek word for õhandbook.ö The Small Catechism is a handbook of the Bible. All the basic knowledge that a Christian needs to understand the faith and live a godly life has been taken from the Bible and distilled into this beautiful little book of Christian piety.

Luther starts with the Ten Commandments.

The First Commandment: You shall have no other gods.

What does this mean? We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things. (SC I)

We have a God above us. He is the Lord God and we are not. He is Almighty and in control. He is righteous and good. And therefore, we should fear Him.

This God is also our heavenly Father. He wants us to be saved. He does not want us to suffer His just wrath. He has provided salvation for us in His Son, Jesus Christ. And therefore, we should love Him.

Our heavenly Father will never leave us nor forsake us. He has promised as much ô and the Bible shows us that He always keeps His promises. So, we should trust Him.

In the Large Catechism, Luther explains how money and possessions form one of the greatest temptations against the First Commandment:

This I must unfold somewhat more plainly, that it may be understood and perceived by ordinary examples of the contrary. Many a one thinks that he has God and everything in abundance when he has money and possessions; he trusts in them and boasts of them with such firmness and assurance as to care for no one. Lo, such a man also has a god, Mammon by name, i.e., money and possessions, on which he sets all his heart, and which is also the most common idol on earth. He who has money

and possessions feels secure, and is joyful and undismayed as though he were sitting in the midst of Paradise. On the other hand, he who has none doubts and is despondent, as though he knew of no God. For very few are to be found who are of good cheer, and who neither mourn nor complain if they have not Mammon. This [care and desire for money] sticks and clings to our nature, even to the grave. (LC I 569)

These words of Dr. Luther should call us to repentance; sometimes, we live and act like we dongt have a Father in heaven. We seek our comfort and peace outside of His gracious promises. But we do have a Father in heaven. He does love us. All His promises are true. And the Lord will surely provide. If that is our belief, then our outward lives will reflect our belief in our acts of generosity and mercy. We will see money and possessions not as gods but rather as tools for doing God work.

Crafty Stitchers


Our group will meet on Saturday,

2023–2025 Mission Grants A Healing Space for At-Risk Children — Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch, ND \$100,000

The Christ-centered, healing ministry of Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch creates an eternal, life giving, impact in the lives of children, age 10 to 18, who have faced unimaginable trauma. Due to childhood traumas of violence, abuse, neglect, and more, Ranch children experience debilitating emptiness and loneliness at the deepest of levels; levels that only Christ can heal. A gap in spiritual care on the Ranchøs Bismarck campus has been a chapel facility specifically designed to be a healing space for traumatized boys and girls. A construction date of Spring 2024 has been set to build a chapel to serve as a healing space to help them know and experience the mercy of Christ and His healing power. This grant will help meet the construction costs of the Chapel on the Bismarck campus and provide healing for at-risk children.


